Reflection

I have recently been reflecting on my time in ministry and I reminded myself of that moment in my ordination service in Chesterfield when the President says to the gathered congregation, "Do you believe and trust that they are, by God's grace, worthy to be ordained?"....the congregation quite literally shout back "They are worthy"... I remember being utterly floored by this. All kinds of emotions welled up inside of me and tears trickled down my cheeks. I had to gather myself quickly as I then had to make all my promises as a presbyter.

It makes me very aware that many of us feel unworthy to do the job that God has called us to do.

In our reading we have Paul writing to a young church leader called Timothy. He shares his thanks for God entrusting him with his ministry...especially knowing that Paul was once a "blasphemer, a persecutor and a man of violence". He had a lot to be thankful to God for...but above all, he wanted to share with Timothy that if God had called you in the work of the Kingdom, he was not alone. Both God and his fellow followers were a strong support group.

Sometimes in our lives and our work we can feel very alone, as though we are the only ones doing stuff !!! The reality is that we are never alone. Paul says that the, "grace of our Lord overflowed for me..." wow...I'll take some of that any day.

Timothy was a young man, new to responsibility. My remembrance of facing all those people at my ordination shout, "they are worthy" still fills me with emotion, because so many times I do not feel worthy, or capable or strong...what I remember is that I am never alone, that people have promised to support me and uphold me and pray for me.

I suppose one of our strengths as a community of faith in Jesus, is that is not about ourselves on our own, but it is a 'community'. We look out for each other and help each other when needed, we worship together, we bless each other, we learn and serve together. All through a faith in Jesus Christ.

But it is more than simply being nice to each other. Sometimes we can be criticized for this or challenged for that...but it is a strength. Christianity can be perceived as weak and foolish by many, because of our understanding of love. But Paul says, 'but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ, for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.'

Let us uphold one another in love as through that love others will see God through us and want to know more of this God for themselves. AMEN
