Reading: 1 Corinthians 2: 13-20

And so it was with me, brothers and sisters. When I came to you, I did not come with eloquence or human wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. I came to you in weakness with great fear and trembling. My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on human wisdom, but on God's power. We do, however, speak a message of wisdom among the mature, but not the wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are coming to nothing. No, we declare God's wisdom, a mystery that has been hidden and that God destined for our glory before time began. None of the rulers of this age understood it, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. However, as it is written: "What no eye has seen, what no ear has heard, and what no human mind has conceived" the things God has prepared for those who love him - these are the things God has revealed to us by his Spirit.

The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. For who knows a person's thoughts except their own spirit within them? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us.

Reflection

Some of Paul's Jewish contemporaries would have once considered him wise in the conventional sense of the word. He had been a Jewish scholar. He knew more about the Jewish Scriptures and theology than most. But here he tells the Corinthians in verse 2 that his converted self, "resolved to know nothing while he was with them except Jesus Christ and him crucified."

True wisdom, he suggests, is in knowing that God's ways in the world is based on God's work to save the world through the cross of Jesus Christ. God's ways, in other words, centre on the apparent weakness of His

Son's willing submission to death. This apparent weakness, Paul says, shapes the way he ministers. "I came to you," he tells Corinth's Christians in verse 3, "in weakness and fear, and with much trembling."

Paul was determined, not to display his intellectual, theological or even physical power to the Christians in Corinth. He, instead, displayed the power of the Holy Spirit. Human nature's wisdom about how things work in our world thinks that those who have the most power dominate in their corner of the world. Paul rejects such conventional wisdom throughout his epistles. He insists that people who are wise to God's ways in the world understand that God works through human weakness to carry out God's plans and purposes. The powerful work of the Spirit is the key to gaining wisdom. No human wisdom, says Paul, can grasp God's ways and plans for our world and God's people. But Paul says, God has revealed it to those open to the Holy Spirit. In verse 13 Paul says, "We have not received the spirit of the world but the Spirit who is from God, that we may understand what God has freely given us."

Isaiah 55: 6-11 says; Seek the Lord while he may be found; call on him while he is near. Let the wicked forsake their ways and the unrighteous their thoughts. Let them turn to the Lord, and he will have mercy on them, for he will freely pardon.

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it."

Paul contrasts the world's understanding of wisdom with the wisdom which God reveals in Christ Jesus and him crucified. Paul insists that not all wisdom is true wisdom. It's a good lesson for us as Jesus' followers to remember, particularly in a culture that exalts one form of wisdom over the one that Paul praises.

Conventional wisdom is materialist. Our culture assumes that the only things that are real are those that are quantifiable and provable. If you can't smell, see, hear or feel something, or somehow otherwise prove it, it isn't real. At least some of those who our materialist culture considers wise believe that matter is the only thing that really matters. The special wisdom to which Paul claims access is God's wisdom that leads God's people to glory and is knowable only by the Holy Spirit.

As the people of God, we must try to proclaim His wisdom available to us through the power of the Holy Spirit in all that we do and say, and trust in God's word that promises. "As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it". If we live in God's wisdom He will fulfil His purposes through us. "What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God." Amen
